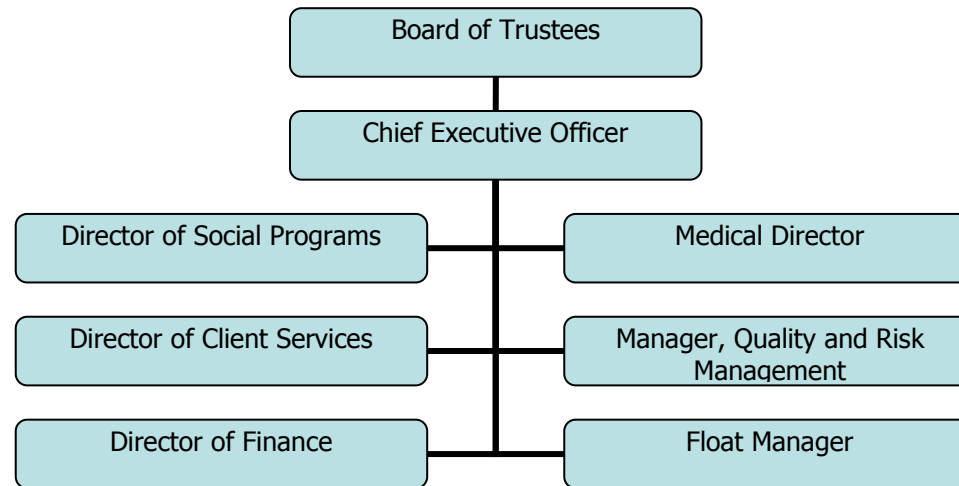

Summary of Services Beaufort-Delta Health and Social Services Authority



The Beaufort-Delta Health and Social Services Authority (BDHSSA) serves a population of approximately seven thousand one hundred people (7,100). A Ministerial appointed Chair and one representative from each of the eight Beaufort-Delta communities provide strategic direction and vision to the health and/or social services facilities in the region: Aklavik, Fort McPherson, Inuvik, Paulatuk, Sachs Harbour, Tsiigehtchic, Tuktoyaktuk and Ulukhaktok. These communities range in size from 120 people (Sachs Harbour) to 3,600 people (Inuvik).

A senior management team, consisting of the Chief Executive Officer, Director of Client Services, Director of Finance, Medical Director and Director of Social Programs implements Board policies and oversees both the work of approximately 245 employees and the administration of approximately 75 contracted services providers.

Our biggest challenge currently is maintaining a qualified and competent staff in a period of staffing shortages, particularly of dental therapists, diagnostic imaging technologists, mental health and addictions counsellors, nurses, pharmacists, physicians and social workers. Changes made in government policies and the Union of Northern Workers collective agreement has had a negative impact on the ability of the Authority to recruit and retain staff. Further serious impediments to retention of staff include the lack of suitable and affordable housing throughout the region.

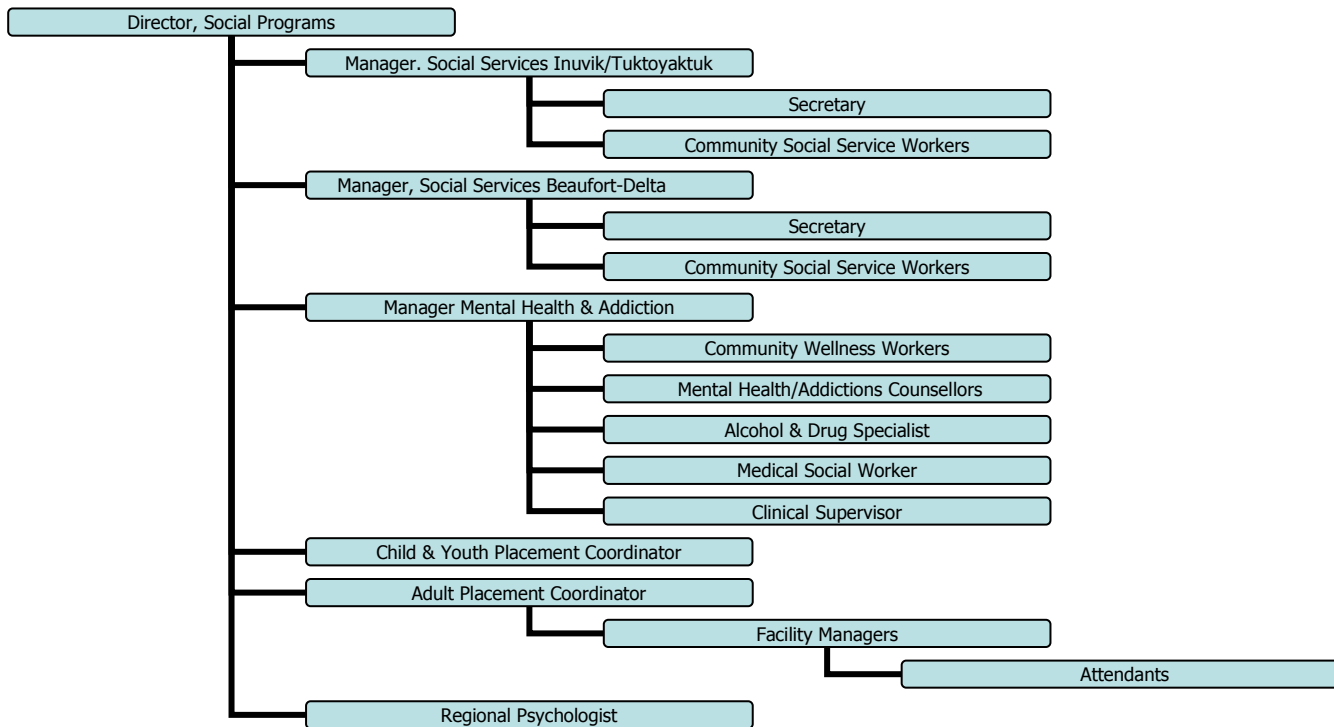
FLOAT MANAGER

Stable management ensures an environment is maintained that facilitates the delivery of programs and services in a consistent efficient manner. Leave benefits of staffed managerial positions coupled with a historical vacancy and transience within management positions impacts the ability to maintain a supportive environment for staff as a whole.

The Float Manager position fills that void through the provision of mentorship and support to directors, managers and supervisors directly as well as within operational areas in the development of new and existing staff.

The position provides vacancy and backfill coverage throughout the Authority in various management roles; assists and supports in the development and implementation of new information systems throughout the organization; and assists and supports the planning, development and implementation of new and existing initiatives and special projects throughout the Authority.

DIRECTOR

The Director of Social Programs is responsible for the planning, controlling, coordinating and directing of social program related services, at both the regional and community levels. This includes overall management and direction setting in the areas of Child and Family Services, Mental Health and Addictions, Family Violence, support services and case management for adult clients who require supported living, and support to aged and handicapped. Intervention and prevention and crisis support are key elements of these programs.

BEAUFORT DELTA REGION PROGRAMS AND SERVICES DIRECTORY

The department provides community-based services to identified groups, individuals and families to protect and improve the social well-being and functioning of people within the community. Front line services delivery is provided by community based Community Social Service Workers.

Program areas include:

- Adoptions
- Child and Family Services
- Child Protection
- Community Development and Liaison Work
- Family Violence Intervention
- Foster Care
- Services to Aged and Handicapped
- Voluntary Family Support

These program area services are provided by the Manager of Social Services Beau-Del who is responsible for program management and direct supervision of Community Social Service Workers in Fort McPherson, Paulatuk, Sachs Harbour, Tsiigehtchic and Ulukhaktok; and the Manager of Social Services Inuvik/Tuktoyaktuk who is responsible for program management and direct supervision of Community Social Service Workers in Inuvik and Tuktoyaktuk.

MENTAL HEALTH AND ADDICTIONS/COMMUNITY COUNSELLING PROGRAMS

This program focuses on outreach, prevention, treatment, and aftercare of mental health, addictions and family violence issues. It is a comprehensive program that provides support to residents in their home community as well as some regional services in Inuvik. The Manager of Mental Health and Addictions is responsible for overall management and program delivery. The Clinical Supervisor is responsible for providing clinical supervision for all community counselling program staff as well as some direct service delivery. Direct services are provided by Mental Health & Addictions Counsellors who provide community-based crisis intervention, therapeutic counselling, and treatment services in the areas of mental health, addictions

and family violence, as well as Community Wellness Workers who provide crisis intervention, supportive counselling, prevention, education, and outreach regarding mental health, addictions and family violence issues.

- Community based addictions treatment services
- Crisis intervention
- Mental Health promotion and education
- Referrals to regional family violence and mental health resources
- Referrals to territorial and out of territory residential treatment program
- Supportive and therapeutic counselling

The Medical Social Worker also falls within this program area and is responsible for delivery of supportive counselling, referrals back to home communities, and discharge planning for Inuvik Regional Hospital clients who have social and emotional needs.

CHILD AND YOUTH PLACEMENT COORDINATOR

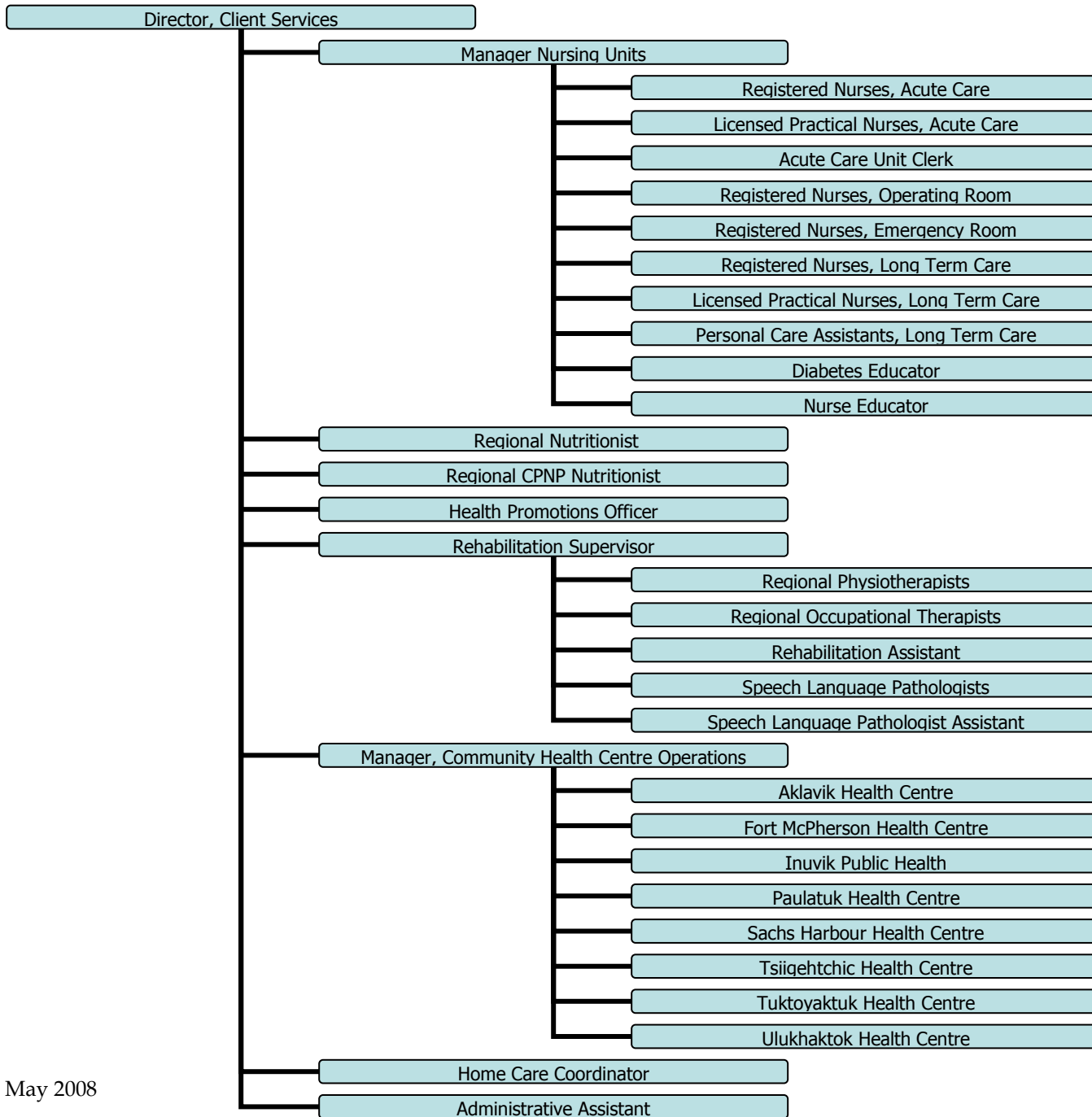
The Child and Youth Placement Coordinator is responsible for recruitment, training and resource development of placement resources for children and youth within the Child and Family Services system. This includes foster homes, the Child Welfare group home, and southern treatment and placement facilities.

ADULT PLACEMENT COORDINATOR

The Adult Placement Coordinator supports clients and their family caregivers when they cannot fully take care of themselves. This includes:

- case management and support in placement of adults from the region who require supported living situations both in the north and south
- management of the Joe Greenland Centre Elders residence
- management of contracted service providers at Charlotte Vehus and Billy Moore supported living homes

DIRECTOR

The Director of Client Services is responsible for the planning, controlling, coordinating and directing of client related services, at both the regional and community levels, which include clinical nursing services (emergency, medical/surgical daycare, acute care unit, operating room, long-term care unit), community nursing services (community health centers and public health unit), health promotion, rehabilitation services (physiotherapy, occupational therapy, and speech), and nutritional services. A major focus of this role is to be proactively involved in the development of strategies that meet current and future health needs within the Beaufort-Delta region.

COMMUNITY HEALTH OPERATIONS

The Manager of Community Health Centre Operations is responsible for managing the eight community health centres and the public health unit in Inuvik and providing clinical support to staff. This position is responsible for planning, co-coordinating, monitoring and evaluating health and human resources in the delivery of primary health care and home care services, as well as in the promotion of health, wellness and social awareness, within the community.

HEALTH PROMOTION

The role of health promotion, which includes disease prevention, is to plan and/or participate in community activities and projects in partnership with other territorial, regional and local organizations. The goal is to raise awareness of and provide education about public health concerns. Promotion and prevention programs and services are provided at the community level through health centres and public health. Regional priorities are tobacco use; dental health; addictions, including alcohol and gambling; injury prevention; community immunization programs; and nutrition (diabetes, obesity, pre-natal, and active living).

HOSPITAL NURSING

The Manager of Nursing Units provides overall management for the 22 bed acute care unit, the 4 bed day care unit, the operating/post anesthesia recovery room, the emergency department, and the 25 bed long term care unit. Hospital services provides community needs for all acute care services: medical\surgical, obstetrics, labour and delivery, intensive care, palliative care, emergency services, pediatrics, psychiatry, and the operating/recovery rooms.

BEAUFORT DELTA REGION PROGRAMS AND SERVICES DIRECTORY

Clients with significant needs or those in emergent situations are transferred from the communities to the Inuvik hospital and by medevac to services outside the region if specialized treatment is required. The long term care unit provides 22 permanent beds and 3 respite beds. Hospital nursing staff includes Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, and Personal Care Assistants who provide direct client care plus a Nurse Educator and a Diabetic Resource Nurse.

REGIONAL NUTRITION

The Regional Nutritionist provides a full range of community and clinical nutrition services in Inuvik and 12 other communities in the Beaufort-Delta and Sahtu regions. The Regional Nutritionist collaborates with other health professionals, as well as community groups, services and organizations to advocate for healthy eating and active living for chronic disease prevention on individual, community, and regional/territorial levels. In-hospital services include acute care, long term care, and outpatient assessment and counselling.

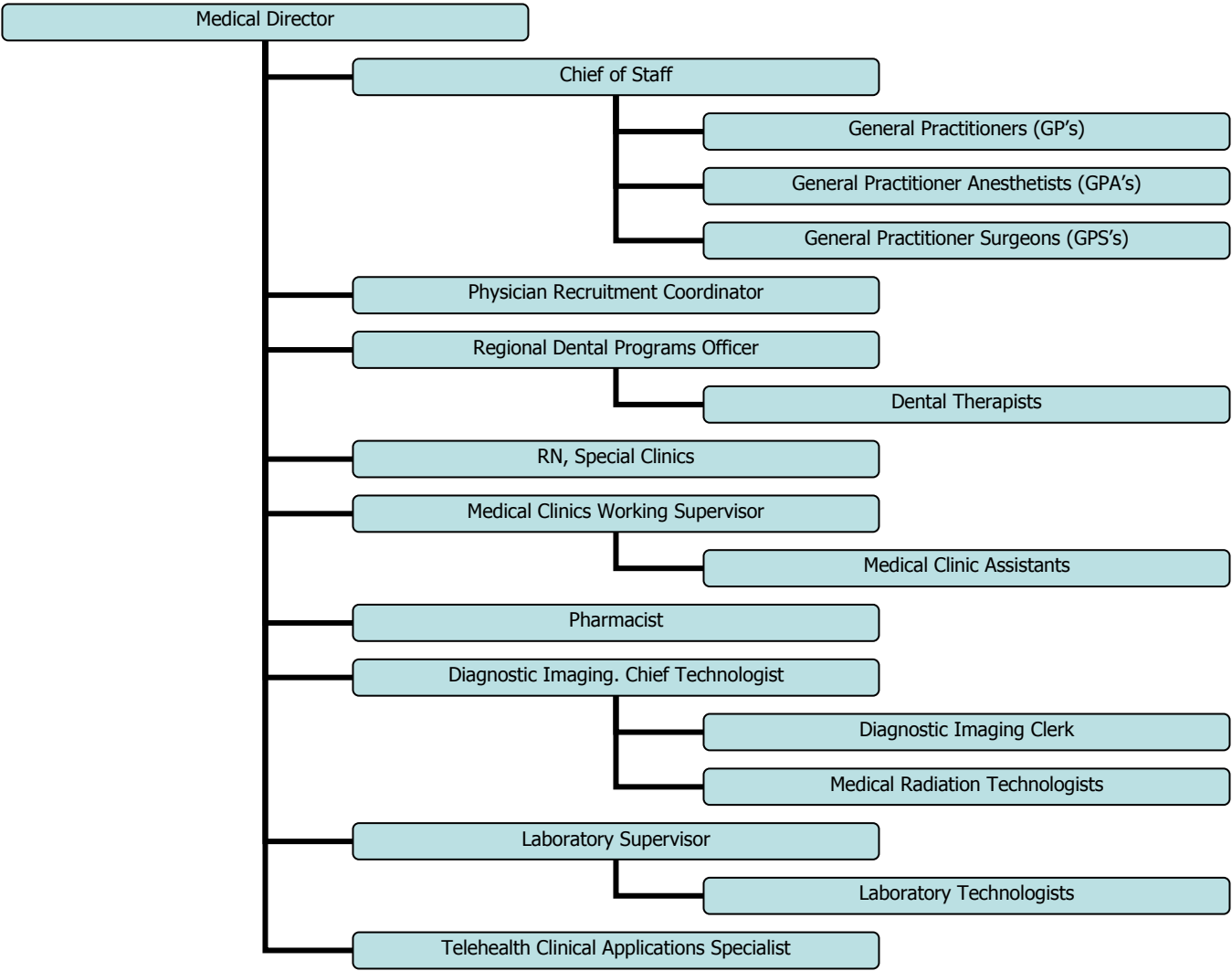
REGIONAL CPNP (Canada Prenatal Nutrition Program) NUTRITIONIST

The Regional CPNP Nutritionist works in collaboration with CPNP workers in Beaufort-Delta and Sahtu communities to provide pre and postnatal nutrition services to improve the health of mothers and infants through improving the diet of pregnant and breastfeeding First Nations and Inuit women, increasing access of nutrition information, services and resources, improving breastfeeding support, initiation and duration rates, and ensuring the appropriate introduction of solid foods to infants. Individualized nutrition counselling for pre and postnatal women as well as group education sessions and cooking classes are also conducted by the CPNP Nutritionist in each of the communities.

REHABILITATION SERVICES

Rehabilitation Services, in conjunction with other health care providers, assist people of all ages to improve, maintain and reach their full potential, from injuries, disabilities and chronic diseases. Referrals come from doctors and nurses in 13 communities. Clinics are held in the communities on average two times a year for three days, depending on the size and needs of the communities. The service delivery model is direct care to hospital, home, communities, and through telehealth and telespeech services. Education and information relating to injury prevention is also provided to all stakeholders.

DIRECTOR

The Medical Director plans and directs all aspects of the Beaufort-Delta Health and Social Services Authority (BDHSSA) medical policies, programs and staffing. The Medical Director is the lead person in medical recruitment and retention as well as in university affiliations by overseeing the visiting medical students and residents. The Medical Director is responsible for smooth functioning of the hospital clinic, the specialist clinics, and the in-town medical clinic. The Medical Director supervises the laboratory and diagnostic imaging services, the regional dental program, the hospital pharmacy and telehealth. The Medical Director's time is equally spent between administrative duties and clinical work. The Medical Director works closely with the Chief of Staff and medical staff in providing quality patient care.

CHIEF OF STAFF

The head of the organization's medical staff is the Chief of Staff. This position is responsible for the smooth functioning of the medical staff operation in both its administrative and professional arms. Duties of the Chief of Staff include:

- Supervision of the overall professional care services given to all in-patients and out-patients
- Responsibility for the general organizational activities of the medical staff committees and clinical departments
- Representation on behalf of the medical staff with the Medical Director and/or hospital administration

The Inuvik Regional Hospital is the only hospital located above Canada's Arctic Circle. This 51 bed (class D) accredited hospital offers acute, long term, preventative and rehabilitative care as well as elective and emergency surgery. There are nine physicians based in Inuvik who provide a full range of medical services to eight communities in the Beaufort-Delta region. Clients with significant needs or those in emergency situations are transferred from the Beaufort-Delta, Fort Good Hope and Colville Lake to Inuvik and by air medevac to services outside the region if specialized treatment is required. The hospital has an affiliation with the University of BC medical programs and provides teaching and mentoring to residents and students (at least one resident and one student per month).

Currently, five of nine full-time physician openings are filled. Only one of these includes * GP-A/GP-S services making it necessary to fill in anesthesia and surgery services, as well as GP services, with a rotation of locum physicians.

Services include:

- physician clinics (morning and afternoon, five days a week)
- emergency room coverage at Inuvik Regional Hospital (24 hours a day seven days a week)
- community clinics in the eight Beaufort-Delta communities (20 physician days per month)
- telephone consultation with health centres (10-15 calls per day)
- consultation regarding medevacs and availability to travel for medevacs
- obstetrics (130-140 deliveries per year)
- inpatient coverage at the Inuvik Regional Hospital (22 acute care beds)
- coverage for three local long term care facilities
- anesthesia and surgery services, both elective and emergency.

SPECIAL CLINICS

Visiting medical specialists from Yellowknife and Edmonton provide clinics in: dermatology, Ear Nose and Throat (ENT), gynecology, internal medicine, neurology, ophthalmology, orthopedics, pediatrics, psychiatry, and surgery. Various specialists provide 80-200 clinic days annually on a rotational basis

MEDICAL CLINICS

Inuvik has two clinics where patients can consult a family physician. One family clinic operates out of the hospital (3,696 visits in the last six months) and the other clinic, Arctic Family Medical House, is located in the town center (2,917 visits in the last six months). Clinic services are also provided through health centres at the community level.

DENTAL PROGRAMS

The goal of the Dental Therapy Program is to work together with parents/caregivers and all other care workers to reduce tooth decay among the pre-school children and school age students from kindergarten thru grade 12. The Regional Dental Programs Officer travels to all the communities promoting dental health, visiting the schools, day care centres and other programs dealing with young children in the community. Dental screening is done at the school. Local health centres handle after-hours dental emergencies.

Programs aimed at reducing tooth decay are:

- well baby clinics
- tooth brushing program
- fluoride school rinse and fluoride varnish

PHARMACY

The Pharmacist dispenses to all in-patients and maintains the pharmaceutical inventory with an annual budget of \$450,000 for the hospital and the 12 regional health centres (Beaufort-Delta and the Sahtu). The hospital pharmacy is the central depot for all vaccines within the region. The Pharmacist chairs both the in-house Pharmacy and Therapeutics and the Medication/IV Safety committees and is also a member of the NWT Pharmacy and Therapeutics committee. The pharmacy operates during office hours Monday to Friday and is on-call 24 hours a day seven days a week.

DIAGNOSTIC IMAGING

Diagnostic Imaging is responsible for ultrasound exams, radiographic exams, and Electro Cardio Gram's (ECG) on a routine basis. They provide a Screening Mammographic Program for the Beaufort-Delta region with mammogram clinics (lasting 10-15 days) held three to four times a year (depending on need and the availability of a trained Mammographer).

All the x-rays and ECG's done in the communities come through the diagnostic imaging department to be sent out for reporting. 1,215 x-rays and ECGs from the community health centres were handled by the department last year. All ECG's, x-rays, ultrasounds and mammograms are sent out for interpretation to Stanton Territorial Hospital or to Insight Medical Imaging in Edmonton with feedback within 12 to 24 hours of when they receive the films. The department sends out and

receives 260 mailbags of x-rays/ultrasounds exams per year. The total number of exams done in the last fiscal year was 5,477 and the total number of units earned by the department was 207,591 (a unit is a minute of time).

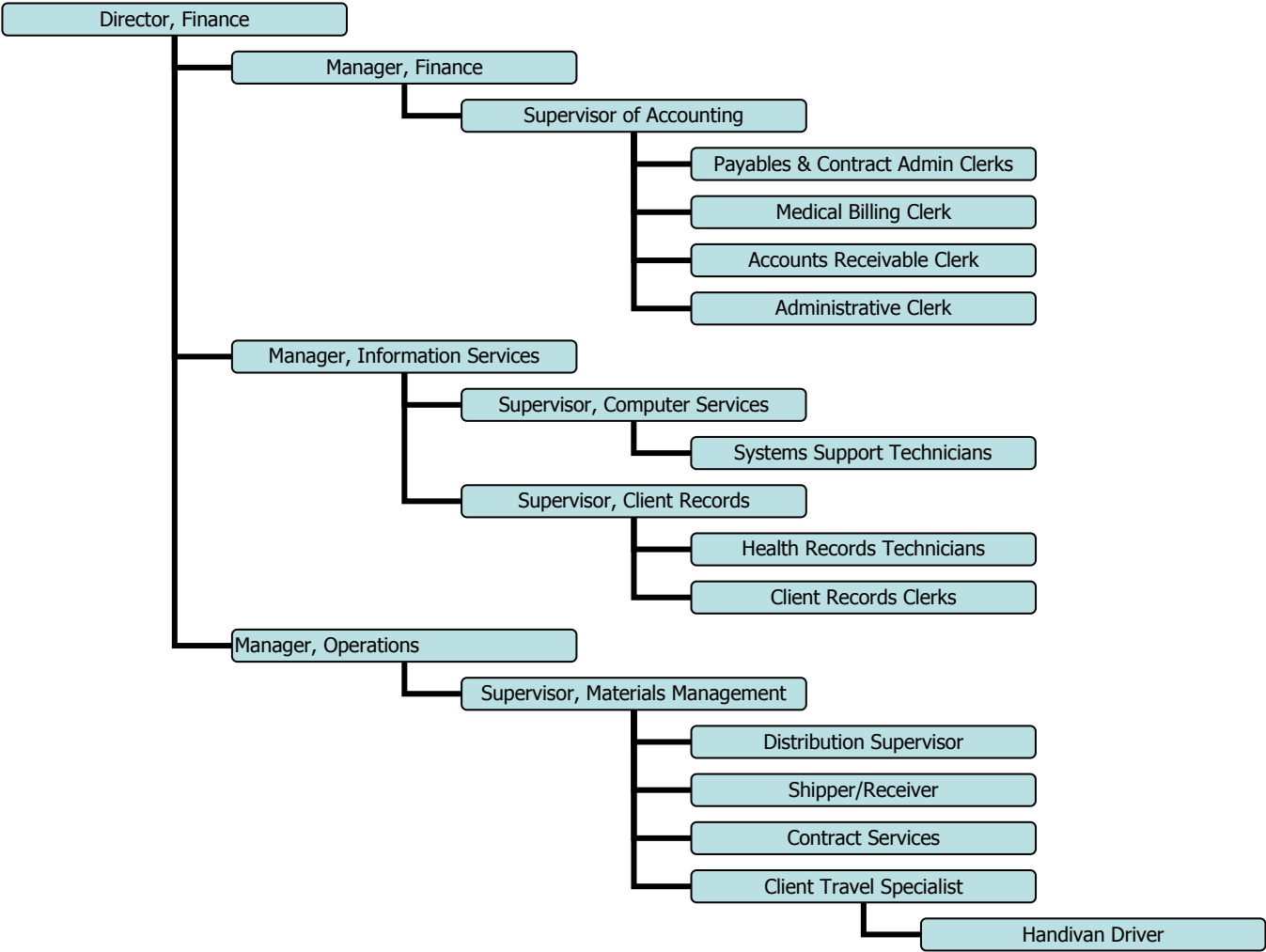
LABORATORY

Inuvik Regional Hospital's laboratory collects, receives and analyzes biological samples in order to assist medical and non-medical professionals in the diagnosis, treatment, and management of disease. Technicians also respond to queries from health center and hospital staff regarding diagnostic lab testing, and forward relevant memos from outside service providers. Water testing for the Beaufort-Delta communities is also provided.

TELEHEALTH

Services enable physicians and other health professionals to consult with clients in remote communities. Inuvik and Ulukhaktok have access to telehealth services, with Tuktoyaktuk soon to follow.

FINANCE

The Department of Finance is responsible for ensuring that all financial reporting requirements of the Beaufort-Delta Health and Social Services Authority (BDHSSA) are met in a timely efficient manner. This includes both external and internal reporting requirements, coordination of annual operating budgeting submissions, compliance monitoring and variance reporting. Critical to the aforementioned is the training of managers/supervisors and directors in the budgeting and reporting process of the BDHSSA. The information is developed in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, financial administration guidelines and directives, Union of Northern Workers collective agreement, relevant government legislation, BDHSSA and the Government of the Northwest Territories Department of Health and Social Services policies. The finance department works closely with both internal and external users of financial information to ensure their needs are met.

The department oversees the BDHSSA annual operating budget, which is in excess of \$35,000,000. The BDHSSA depends on the finance department to ensure financial information for the organization as a whole is accessible and useful to management in the challenge of allocating limited financial resources in delivering health and social programs to the citizens of the region.

COMPUTER SERVICES DEPARTMENT

This computer services department maintains the BDHSSA networks and computer systems in Inuvik (hospital; Arctic Family Medical Clinic and the public health unit at the Semmler building) as well as all of the communities in the region. Computer services provide support for network infrastructure (hardware and software) and for computer hardware. Community support is performed mostly through the use of telephone support and remote control software with a minimum of two visits per year for each community for regular maintenance and to resolve hardware issues. There are nine separate/independent networks used by approximately 235 staff members. There are approximately 160 staff members that use 140 computers in the Inuvik Regional Hospital and 75 staff members that use 65 computers in the communities. There are 15 servers in the hospital plus one for each community and one for the Semmler building. This totals 23 servers and approximately 200 workstations.

CLIENT RECORDS DEPARTMENT

Client records department secures and maintains all patient hospital records. This department files all inpatient and outpatient information (i.e. doctors' notes, radiology, laboratory, physiotherapy, and nurses' notes) into the patient's record as required. Release of Information (with the patient's consent) is done as required and in accordance with pertinent legislation. Health Records Technicians transcribe and electronically check physicians' dictation. They also code patient diagnosis and operations and submit same to Canadian Institute of Health Information where it is nationally organized into statistics to be used by

various levels of government. This department maintains and tracks over 53,000 records which are used by various disciplines in the hospital setting for continuing patient care.

MANAGER OF OPERATIONS

This management position ensures the management and coordination of service delivery of operations and support services for our organization. This manager is responsible for providing direction and leadership to material management, support services (kitchen, housekeeping, and transient centre), facility maintainers (GNWT Public Works and Services), travel, operational planning and the environment. This position manages the provision of space, equipment and material, leases and security to all physical buildings under the lease and or ownership of the Authority. Overall this position is responsible to ensure the continuous functionality of facilities thus impacting the working environments of virtually all staff and clients that the BDHSSA employs or serves.

MATERIALS MANAGEMENT

The materials management department provides over-sight expertise and guidance throughout the organization to ensure sound purchasing practices in conformance with regulations. There is a stores department located in the Inuvik Regional Hospital that maintains an inventory of stock items including medical / surgical supplies, standardized forms, stationery and select general office supplies. Individual departments can order from a catalogue of stock items.

The BDHSSA Purchasing Officer is the only individual that can issue a purchase order on behalf of the BDHSSA. A purchase order is both an authorization for the vendor/supplier to deliver goods or services and an acknowledgement to pay when the goods or services have been provided. The purchase order is a fundamental and essential document in accounting functions.

CLIENT TRAVEL SPECIALIST

The Client Travel Specialist oversees maintenance and employee use of all motor vehicles in all eight communities, as well as arranging transportation services for staff on duty travel and Social Services clients traveling by road or air. BDHSSA provides a handivan bus service Monday to Thursday to the Elders Day Program. This Department provides as and when services to wheelchair clients, the long term care residents, daily meals on wheels delivery and daily pick up services at the drug stores in Inuvik, Arctic Family Medical House and GNWT Human Resources.
